

**Minnesota State Lottery**  
**Second Chance Promotion**  
**“Skee-Ball”**  
**January 2, 2018**

**1.1. Name of Promotion**

The name of this promotion is “Skee-Ball Second Chance Promotion.”

**2.1. Definitions**

- A. **“Skee-Ball”** or **“Scratch Ticket”** or **“Ticket”** means the Minnesota State Lottery (the “Lottery”) Scratch Game #693.
- B. **“Minnesota Second Chance Promotion”** or **“Second Chance Promotion”** means the drawings conducted by the Lottery in conjunction with Skee-Ball Second Chance Promotion.

**3.1. Duration**

The Second Chance Promotion will begin at 5:00:00 a.m. Central Time (“CT”) on January 2, 2018, and conclude at 11:59:59 p.m. CT on February 27, 2018.

**4.1. Eligibility**

- A. A person may enter the Second Chance Promotion by becoming a member of the Players Club and supplying all of the required registration information and entering the 10-digit validation number found under the scratch-off latex coating of a non-winning Skee-Ball Scratch Game Ticket.
- B. Each non-winning Ticket entered will receive one (1) entry in the Second Chance Promotion.
- C. One (1) winner per household per drawing is allowed.
- D. The submission of a winning Ticket invalidates that entry.
- E. Employees (including immediate family residing in the same household) of the Lottery, employees (including immediate family residing in the same household) of any company that is not eligible to receive a prize from the Lottery pursuant to a contract with the Lottery, and all other persons prohibited by law are ineligible to participate or receive a prize from this Second Chance Promotion.

- F. The person who submits an entry must be 18 years of age or older.
- G. The Lottery is not responsible for delayed, lost, or misdirected electronic submissions made through the Internet.
- H. A person may enter more than once; however, each player may use only one (1) unique Ticket number per entry. Multiple entries using the same non-winning Ticket number and entries made via automated computer scripts or other programming techniques will be disqualified.
- I. A player who uses a non-winning Ticket as an entry in this Second Chance Promotion that has previously been used in any other Minnesota Lottery Second Chance promotion or contest will be considered ineligible.
- J. By participating, players agree to these official rules and to the decisions of the Lottery which will be final and binding in all respects.
- K. An entry will be considered invalid if it does not meet all of the requirements for eligibility stated in this section

**5.1. The Second Chance Promotion Drawings**

- A. To enter the Skee-Ball Second Chance Promotion, a player must enter a non-winning Ticket via the process described above. The Lottery will conduct one (1) Second Chance Promotion drawing. The eligibility and schedule are described in the table below:

- B. The Lottery will, by use of mechanical or other devices, randomly determine which of the entries submitted are selected.

C. The Lottery will conduct one (1) drawing with one (1) prizewinner for the following prize:

- One (1) Grand Prize consisting of \$1,000 in cash

The Lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes for any reason, including based on availability.

D. A person may win only once in any one Second Chance Promotion drawing.

E. Odds of being selected as the prizewinner in the Skee-Ball drawing are dependent on the number of entries received.

F. The prizewinner's name will be posted on the Contest Winners page of the mnlottery.com website following the drawing and after the prizewinner has been verified. The list will remain on the Contest Winners pages for the duration of the Claim Period (as defined below).

G. By entering this sweepstakes, the prizewinner consents to full use of any and all information they provide on the entry form for publicity, public relations, and content creation purposes, including on the Lottery's social media channels and mnlottery.com, by the Lottery. The prizewinner may be required to execute an Affidavit of Eligibility form and appropriate releases and authorizations. Refusal to do so may result in forfeiture of any prize won.

H. A prize won in a Second Chance Promotion may not be assigned or transferred to another person. Federal, state, or local taxes on any prize are the sole responsibility of the prizewinner. All applicable federal, state, or local laws apply.

## 5.2. **Claiming Prizes**

Each person whose entry was selected in the Second Chance Promotion drawing to win a prize valued at \$600 or more must fill out and submit a claim form to the Lottery. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Lottery, the claim will be denied and the player will be notified immediately.

If a prizewinner is delinquent in the payment of Minnesota state taxes or owes a debt as defined in Minn. Stat. § 270A.03, subd. 5, the amount due will be deducted from the value of the prize. If the prizewinner owes a debt as described above, they will be given thirty (30) calendar days from the date the Lottery informed them of the existence of a debt in which to fully satisfy the debt, as determined by the Minnesota Department of Revenue. In the event that the prizewinner fails to completely satisfy the debt within 30 days, the Lottery will liquidate the non-cash prize and forward any proceeds received to the Department of Revenue to satisfy or partially satisfy the debt on the prizewinner's behalf. If any cash remains after the Lottery has forwarded the proceeds of a non-cash prize to the Minnesota Department of Revenue, the prizewinner will be awarded the remaining cash.

### **5.3. Claim Period**

All prizes in this Second Chance Promotion must be claimed within one (1) year of the date of the drawing at which the prize was awarded. If, however, the one (1) year deadline is a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday, a claim must be submitted by the close of business the following business day. The Lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes based on when the prize is claimed during the claim period. The Lottery will post the end of the claim period on [mnlottery.com](http://mnlottery.com). ### **5.4. Allowance for Delay of Payment**

The Lottery may delay payment pending a final determination by the Lottery under any of the following circumstances.

- A. if a dispute occurs or it appears likely that a dispute may occur regarding the prize;
- B. if a dispute occurs or it appears likely that a dispute may occur regarding the ownership of the entry;
- C. if there is any question regarding the identity of the claimant;
- D. if there is any question regarding the validity of the entry or the claim presented for payment; or

- E. if the claim is subject to any setoff for delinquent debts owed by the claimant under Minn. Stat., § 349A.08, subd. 8. No liability for interest for any delay will accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

#### 5.5. **Emergency Termination**

If, for any reason, it is not possible to run all or any part of the Second Chance Promotion as planned due to, without limitation, errors in these official rules or advertising for this promotion, tampering, unauthorized intervention, fraud, technical failures, human error, or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the sole judgment of the Lottery, could corrupt or affect the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of this promotion, the Lottery reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to cancel, terminate, modify, or suspend the promotion.

#### 6.1. **Governing Law**

By submitting an entry into the Second Chance Promotion, a person agrees to comply with and abide by these game procedures; Minn. Stat. § 349A (State Lottery); Minn. R. 7857 (Lottery Prize Payments); and all final decisions of the Director of the Lottery. All applicable federal, state, or local laws apply. Second Chance Promotion entry offer void where prohibited by law.
